



Ruth Lewis is a Senior Lecturer in Sociology at Northumbria University. She has published widely on feminist activism, intimate partner violence, and lethal violence. Recent research examines: young women's engagements with feminism and the development of feminist communities; feminists' experiences of and resistance to online abuse; experiences of women-only space as a political strategy, and gender based violence (GBV) in universities. Earlier research includes the first UK evaluation of domestic violence

perpetrators programmes and the first sociological UK examination of homicide. As well as being active in her local and regional communities, Ruth is founding member and Co-Convenor of the Universities Against GBV network, and Co-Convenor of the British Sociological Association Gender Study group.
